Land Agency Liaisons

Liaisons work with their respective land agency personnel to coordinate Overland's volunteer activities in assisting the land agency with planning, building and maintaining the land agency's natural surface trails. The club has a strong relationship with our regional land agencies, and that requires great liaisons to make sure our voice is heard!

Overland's liaisons work with the following land agencies:

- City of Fort Collins Natural Areas
- Larimer County
- Lory State Park
- USFS Canyon Lakes District
- State of Wyoming (Curt Gowdy and Glendo State Parks)

The liaisons coordinate Overland's volunteer activities with their land agency to promote great trails in our area. Specific activities include:

- Meet with land agency personnel early in the year to discuss trail building and maintenance options for the year. Determine the specific trail project(s), agree on dates for trail day(s) and the needed Overland resources.
- Prepare for trail days, which includes recruiting volunteers through notices to members, and coordinating the tool trailer, lunch, crew leads, etc.
- Walk the trail prior to the trail day with land agency personnel to discuss specific lines and/or needed maintenance.
- Lead the Overland portion of trail days in conjunction with land agency personnel.

Liaisons should also attend Overland Trail Committee monthly meetings and report liaison activities.

Liaisons are expected to interact with their land agency personnel throughout the year to ensure we maintain great relationships with the agency. Liaisons help the club bring suggestions and issues to their land agency, and disseminate information about the land agency trail planning and other information to the Overland membership. These positions are important to help Overland work effectively with the land agencies to create and maintain multi-use trails for our community!
